



OUR VISION

In 2016 we launched the Pay it Forward scheme, an award-winning scheme which enables local young people, families and individuals experiencing disadvantage to come to the pantomime at the Tron for free.

Funds raised throughout the year, through bucket collections and donations, pay for our participants to attend the pantomime. Thanks to the generosity of our supporters we can also provide extras such as ice creams, goodie bags and a Pay it Forward party in order to complete a magical theatre experience.

We are always looking for ways to grow and develop Pay it Forward and reach more participants than before. This year was our biggest Pay it Forward yet; we gave away over 700 tickets and 400 goodie bags. We also had a dedicated Pay it Forward "grotto" which meant the children and young people attending could select a book and toy of their choice.

Pay it Forward is a community initiative – we work with local charities and youth groups to identify participants, and we involve local businesses in our activities and fundraising.

Since we launched:

- £79, 355 raised in total
- 2500 tickets donated
- 2000 plus ice creams eaten
- 1500 plus goodie bag gifted
- 50 plus charities and community groups worked with

PAY IT FORWARD PARTNERS

This year we worked with 24 groups with participants who have experienced social or economic disadvantage.

We aim to be inclusive with our groups; this year we included participants from 21 different nationalities, ranging in age from 5 months to 80 years old. Our participants include people experiencing hardship in different ways, whether through financial disadvantage, surviving domestic violence, seeking asylum, living with a disability or other socioeconomic factors.

THE GROTTO

For the first time this year we also had a dedicated Pay it Forward "grotto". We decorated the room with the help of the Tron production team and displayed all the gifts that we had arranged for the children. They were then able to pick their own books and toys to take home. We also invited 150 of our participants to a party with treats, face-painting and craft activities which made the theatre experience a great day out for all included. The Tron Ambassadors, young people who are on a year-long work experience programme with the Tron, helped to prepare goodie bags and craft activities, which gave them hands on experience of community outreach. Over the course of the project over 400 children and young people visited the Grotto, receiving a bag of snacks and a selection box as well as toys, a book and their own pick and mix from the sweet station.



RELAXED PERFORMANCE

This year we had our first ever Relaxed Performance of the panto. We worked with a consultant to design a theatre experience inclusive to all, including neurodivergent people and children or adults with complex needs. In addition to changes to sudden noises or effects used in the show, we set up a separate chill out zone with sensory lights and bean bags for anybody needing some time out. All our Front of House team received tailored training ahead of the performance and were on hand to help everyone feel comfortable on the day. We invited groups from Alzheimer Scotland, Sense, Enable, The Mungo Foundation and Crossreach to attend the performance for free with ice cream.

ADDITIONAL WORKSHOPS

One of the groups we partnered with - Home Start Glasgow North and North Lanarkshire - work with families and children too young to come to panto. So they didn't miss out, our Participation team facilitators delivered three festive play workshops to over 60 young people and parents and carers in total. The workshops were free of charge and each child received a Christmas gift.

The Souter Charitable Trust donated £2500 to enable 125 young people to attend The Wonderful Wizard of Oz. The Rozelle Charitable Trust donated £2500 towards tickets, a PiF Christmas party, additional treats and gifts. Davidson Asset Management have supported Pay it Forward since 2018, with a combination of cash donations from staff and collections of treats for children.
