DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Uma Nada-Rajah joined the Traverse Theatre as one of our Writers in Residence in 2021.

During her time with us she shared a first idea that would eventually go on to become Black Hole Sign, a bold, complex and darkly comic play that brought together her two professional worlds – one as a practising critical care nurse and the other as one of Scotland's most exciting playwrights.

Since that initial idea and its subsequent commission, the play has been on a long creative journey, developing through innumerable drafts, countless developments and multiple readings. Throughout, Uma's experience as a practising nurse has deeply informed the play and it's this perspective, alongside the views of many other NHS workers interviewed as part of the process, that gives *Black Hole Sign* such a deep sense of authenticity and rich spirit.

At its core *Black Hole Sign* is a play about Care. It's asks why we should care for those around us, what it means to care for those in need and how, in an increasingly isolated world, we can ensure care (in its widest sense) remains at the heart of our health service.

Working with Uma to bring this story to life has been a huge privilege. The process has demanded rigour, openness and a collaborative spirit from everyone involved. The Traverse Theatre has long been a home for radical new voices and I'm proud that this production continues that tradition in collaboration with our brilliant partners at the Tron Theatre and National Theatre of Scotland.

Huge thanks to the incredible creative team, cast and collaborators who have poured such skill, imagination and care into this work. I hope we have built a world that is surreal, sharp and thought-provoking. One that honours Uma's bold writing and the incredible character of the NHS and the people that make it.

Uma is a graduate of École Philippe Gaulier and a previous participant of the Royal Court's Young Writers' Programme. In 2014 Uma won the New Playwrights Award from Playwrights' Studio Scotland. Her play *Exodus* had its premiere at the Traverse Theatre in August 2022.

She works as a staff nurse in critical care with NHS Scotland.

Gareth Nicholls is Artistic Director of the Traverse Theatre.

Anna Orton is a designer working across Theatre, Dance, Opera and Exhibition. Her previous work exhibiting, performing and curating as a visual artist in some of Scotland's most pioneering spaces continues to influence her work in performance design.

Her design work includes the multi-award-winning production of Handel's *Messiah* directed by Tom Morris, which premiered at Bristol Old Vic and was followed by a national cinema and online streaming release.


