STAND & DELIVER: THE LEE JEANS SIT-IN

In a factory like this, you're part of a team. You're a family.

Greenock 1981.

Faced with the threat of their factory closing, and with 240 jobs on the line, there's no way the women of the Lee Jeans factory are going down without a fight.

They barricade the doors, take a stand against corporate greed and stage a sit-in that lasts for 7 long months.

Developed in conversation with some of the key women involved in the strike, this new play is full of authentic details that bring this significant moment in Scottish history to life.

Played out to a live 80's soundtrack, this is the true story of the gallus Greenock girls who fought a battle against injustice that thrust them onto the world stage.

From an idea conceived by Paul English and Frances Poet.

"1981 was a time of banging pop hits but also economic crisis and the steady erosion of legal rights. When I was still in nappies, the Lee Jeans workforce, made up predominantly of underestimated working women, discovered their own agency and found their voice. It is my privilege as a writer to amplify that voice for audiences today and remind us all that we too can be agents for change." – Frances Poet, Writer

Flora stands on the roof, smoking. As the snow begins to fall, she reflects on the night just passed. During her shift, Flora told a lie so convincingly that she frightened herself. Was she placing compassion before truth, or was she exposing a darkness within herself? As lights flicker on and the city awakes, she travels back in time. Back to the chaos-fuelled, fluorescent-lit corridors of Ward 7. Back into the room of the girl she lied to.

Using *Baby Mash-up, what on Earth are you doing?* as a starting point for discussion, stillpoint offers an opportunity to hear readings of work not often presented and to openly discuss innovation in new writing.

Led by a presentation of **Soz Redland's** ground-breaking *David and the Hedgehog*, we'll be diving into the questions, concerns, and dreams that drive the writers 'breaking the rules'. In this play, David saves a hedgehog from certain death. They swap places, and something is fundamentally altered in the order of the universe. This is a poignant and gloriously funny play about settling in our own strangeness and learning how to not feel prickly in our own skin – one not to be missed.

TRON CREATIVE

The Tron looks forward to engaging with the thriving freelance community of artists and creatives, be that in training, early or mid-career, who live and work here in Glasgow and across Scotland.

Tron Creative feeds our artistic programme, forging dynamic pathways for theatre-makers to develop their craft and their practice in meaningful and ambitious ways. Our hope is that this programme enables theatre-makers, including directors, designers, technicians and writers, to work at their best, deliver brilliantly, and bolster their careers; be that a more assured pursuit of their own artistic enquiry, or a project that will live on the Tron stages in the future.

LABWEEK

LabWeek is a weeklong residency opportunity for theatre-makers to play and experiment with an idea. **LabWeek** aims to provide support that will move a project forward both creatively and logistically. The residency includes a week in the Changing House and a £3,500 budget contribution.

LabWeek applications will open on **Monday 7 September 2026**. The deadline for applications will be **Monday 5 October**, with all applicants notified of the outcome by **Monday 2 November**.

LabWeek will take place from **25-29 January 2027**.

MAKING SPACE

Making Space is our initiative that offers up last-minute rehearsal space in our building at vastly reduced rates for artists and theatre-makers.

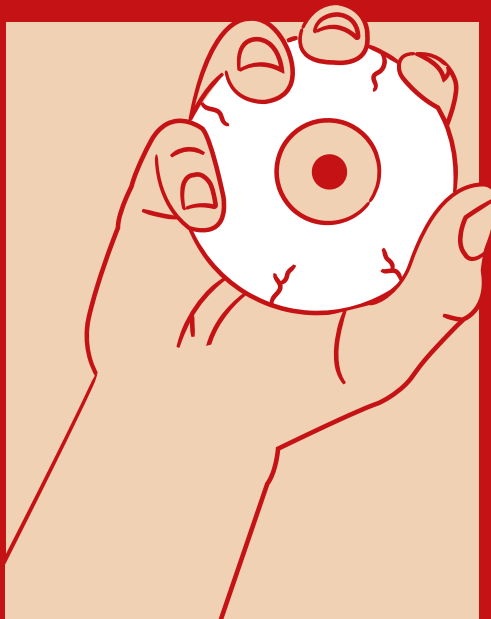

2026 PROJECTS

TRONVERSATIONS start creative conversations, deliver advocacy-style engagement and organise theatre visits that encourage new audiences to come along and visit the Tron for the first time. We aim to build effective and meaningful partnerships with a diverse range of communities reflecting the rich cultural landscape of Glasgow.

Tronversations will take place for *The Trials* and *Stand & Deliver: The Lee Jeans Sit-In* as well as in each of the locations of our community tour of *My Romantic History*.

For *The Trials*, we will work with youth groups exploring the current climate crisis and how we can hold adults accountable for their actions.

For *Stand & Deliver: The Lee Jeans Sit-In*, we will explore the power of workers uniting to challenge injustice using an 80's soundtrack and fashion as inspiration.

For *My Romantic History*, we will work with local community groups, swiping right and recalling our first loves, disastrous dates and giving dating advice to our younger selves.

PAY IT FORWARD

Pay It Forward is a fundraising initiative which enables local community groups working with children, families and adults experiencing disadvantage to attend our Christmas panto and other Tron productions throughout the year, for free. Running since 2016, we have provided over **3,820 free tickets** for our productions, to communities and groups experiencing barriers to attendance.

OUR SHOW/YOUR SHOW

Our Community Ensemble is for those interested in practically exploring the themes, content and creation of the shows presented as part of the Tron programme.

Each term is fun and varied. Activities include our ensemble attending a range of shows at the Tron, exploring the text from plays they have seen together and using the themes as a springboard to make their own work. Most recently our ensemble created a response piece to our Autumn 2025 production of *Black Hole Sign* by Uma Nada-Rajah which was presented on the Tron main stage in front of an invited audience.

The ethos of our ensemble is to bring together a range of different life experiences and perspectives, and we guarantee a warm welcome and an inclusive space to learn both creatively and about each other.
